potion station and used for painting and printing on the outdoor easel.




In the classroom we made apple crumble with apples picked from the trees. The children were able to bring this home to share with their families.



# Message from Mrs Peach - Juniper Class


In Juniper class we have been looking at local habitats and finding out about where different living things live. We looked under rocks and in trees to discover what was living there. The children found lots of species and they drew pictures of them and their habitats. We have also discussed that plants and trees are also living things which require different habitats to survive.





In maths we have been learning about place value. The children have been making numbers with base ten and calculating how many 1000s, 100s, 10s and 1s are in their number. We have also been breaking the numbers into different values to show that numbers can be made differently.

#### Message from Mr Norfolk - Sycamore Class



Children in Sycamore class have started the term off in an excellent manner! They have started to look at our theme for this term which is 'Do all societies impact the planet the same way?' In our whole class reading sessions this week we have been discussing the picture book 'The Arrival'. Using their skills of curiosity, the children have just started to delve into the book and look at the issues of immigration and refugees. There have been some fantastic thoughts, questions and answers!
